Double Consonant: In the Gerudo alphabet, letters are not typically placed directly beside each other. For this, there is a special consonant, which when placed after a vowel, doubled it.

Examples:

η	bb	μ	rr
ς	ss	λ	ll


When a word has a consonant, a vowel then the same consonant again, this rule is ignored.

Vowels

The Gerudo Vowels come in three forms. These vowels can be at the beginning of a word or after another dissimilar vowel.

Stand Alone:



Single Vowel: Normal Gerudo vowels rest above the previous consonant.

Double Vowel: The double vowel, any place a vowel is written twice, is placed underneath the previous consonant.

Examples:
